

A large Victorian period mahogany wall clock, As Found, 124cm high and 52cm at its widest, with eight day striking movement, weights and pendulum, with a winding key and door key, white enamel dial worn and appears to read Jas Park Preston, not tested, lots of wear to the case, notably at the lower where veneered has dried out
