(71cm.) high (small bald spot to lower right on back of head, felt to toes expertly repaired, bottom of left foot pad felt also expertly repaired, slight fading to muzzle) this bear was sold at Giengen Steiff Festival in June 2002 and is now known as Duke £4,000-6,000
- An early Steiff centre seam teddy bear, circa 1910, with golden mohair, black boot button eyes, pronounced clipped muzzle, black stitched nose, mouth and claws, swivel head, jointed elongated limbs with felt pads, hump and inoperative growler –18in. (45.5cm.) high (thinning to top of head, left hand pad with three small holes and right foot pad with hole to top of felt, stuffed settled in arms slightly)

- An early Steiff teddy bear, circa 1910 from the Growlies of Scotland collection and star of STV's Taggart, with golden mohair, black boot button eyes, pronounced clipped muzzle, black stitched nose, mouth and claws, swivel head, jointed elongated limbs with replacement felt pads, hump, inoperative growler and FF underscore button –24in. (61cm.) high (thinning and bald areas, nose darned, right side of mouth missing, left ear split on seam and restitched) this bear appeared in a 1988 episode of STV studio's detective series Taggart starring Mark McManus and was part of a scene where a young man is clutching this bear and Taggart says 'I'd give any money for a bear like that!' and comes with a press black and white photograph from the scene, a colour photograph of McManus with this bear and a few press clippings £1,000-1,500

- A 1920s British Pip the dog from Pip, Squeak and Wilfred, probably Farnell, with black and white mohair, clear and black glass eyes with brown painted backs, white mohair muzzle, black stitched nose and mouth, swivel head, jointed limbs with white mohair paws and tail –8 ½in. (21.5cm.) high (some discolouration to black mohair and slight wear)

(61cm.) high (slight damage to pads and light general wear) previously in the Susan Collard Collection sold in these rooms on the 8th December 2022 as lot 115 £200-300



A 1930s Chad Valley teddy bear with provenance, with light golden mohair, pronounced clipped muzzle, black stitched bulbous nose, mouth and claws, swivel head, jointed limbs, card lined feet, inoperative squeaker and uncovered button in ear –20in. (51cm.) high (missing eyes, pads covered, some wear and thinning); and an original photograph of the original owner with her pony - this bear and the following two lots were the childhood toys of Agnes Leith (nee Moore). She was born in May 1926 in Clarkson, outside Glasgow. She had an older brother. She was definitely not into dolls as a child and teddy bears were her thing. Her main interest was horses and she was lucky enough to have a pony and then a horse as she was growing up. Probably against her parents' wish for her to do something more traditional for a girl, she attended Auchencruive Agriculture College where she did a National Dairying Diploma. Her job as a young woman was to go around the local farms testing the quality of the milk.
